

Attachment 1 – Existing and Proposed Signage Minnivale Rest Area -

Recommended New Signage:

- A. Parking signage to separate the Council permission to camp for up to 2 nights/48 hour on the former Minnivale Tennis Club site, and the permissibility to park up to 24 hours in a road side rest area (Caravan Parks and Camping Grounds Regulations 1997 sub-regulations 11(1)(b)&(c)); this will require **P_{24h}** signage on the road reserve side. This separation of rest areas can be used to allow persons in transit to meet the road side rest area regulation compliance, and also allow the Rangers to move persons on from the Minnivale Tennis Club to the road side rest area in those circumstances requiring such actions:



- B. Proposed rest area signage done in 'Parking' colour style to distinguish that it is not a Licensed Facility Park or Grounds and instead is simply land a person has the legal right to occupy for up to 2 nights (48HRs) in any period of 28 consecutive days as authorised by Council resolution:

**Caravan / RV / Camping
Permitted for No More than 2
Nights (≤ 48 HRs) in any Period
of 28 Consecutive Days**

By Council Resolution #. #. #; pursuant to Regulation 11(1)(a) of the Caravan Parks and Camping Grounds Regulations 1997.

- C. Proposed signage that sets out the limitations of the Minnivale Tennis Club site and justifies why only a maximum of 2 nights is permitted along with advisory that penalties could apply and that rangers patrol the area:

**Limited Services Provided. Tap Water Non-Potable.
For the Avoidance of Doubt this Location Is Not a
Licensed Facility Park or Grounds, and is Provided by
the Shire of Dowerin in Good Faith.
Penalties can Apply for Stays Exceeding 2 Nights
(≤ 48 HRs) in any 28 day period. Rangers Patrol this
Location.**

E. The tap water is deemed non-potable by notation on the Water Bill by Water Corporation “Your water supply must be treated further before use...” due to distance from treatment sites. This is to say the water does not meet Australian Drinking Water Guidelines and is an advisory to undertake treatments and use at own risk. The following signage is now required for all taps (2 of) and also for the dump point washdown area due to sewage contamination risk:



Non Potable Water signage required to be installed at the tap located on this one of the two toilet buildings, and also a legal requirement for taps used for washdown of dump point facilities:



Non Potable Water signage required to be installed at the tap located on the second of the two toilet buildings:



F. Change the Wheatbelt Way signage to “Minnivale 24HR & 48HR Rest Areas ▶”



G. Update this wooden signage (three options), or remove entirely (one option...):
